Sharing the stage with blues superstars like Jeff Healey, John Mayal, Robben Ford, James Harman, and Canned Heat, The RoadDogz are a fun, festive, full-service live-band extravaganza. Combining the best of danceable classics, rockin' blues and smoky soul, The RoadDogz stand out on the Seattle blues scene. These dogs may look a little grizzled, but on stage they play like pups: fun to watch with an irresistible rompin' sound.

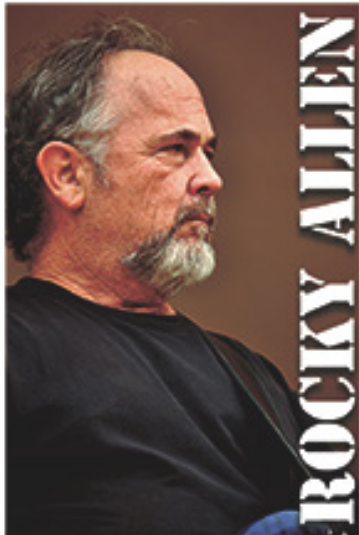
Sets include blues-influenced classic rock like Rolling Stones and The Doors mixed with a few eclectic choices like Tom Waits and Southern Culture on the Skids. Mixed in are few foot-stompin originals and the obligatory homage to the blues greats: Jimmie Reed, Willie Dixon, Muddy Waters, Stevie Ray Vaughn, Buddy Guy and Jimi Hendrix. Audiences love trying to stump these guys on requests.



The RoadDogz balance dynamic instrumentals with talented vocals.

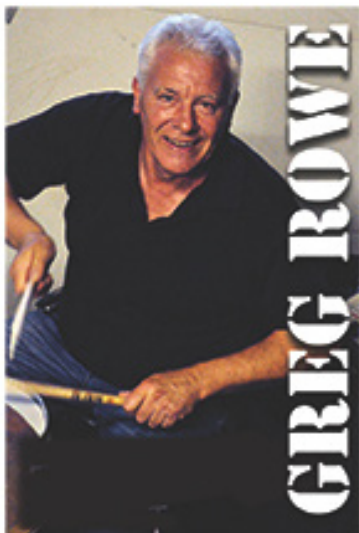
☞ *Crowds take notice of the unique singing style of Dan O'Bryant, recognized by Billboard as a voice of distinction. Dubbed Deacon Dan and voted most likely to lead a blues revival, his growly sound has been compared with the high-energy delivery of John Fogarty and Joe Cocker. Whether he's interviewing local blues legends on the radio, recording voiceovers or kicking out some Cold Shot, Dan's voice makes an impact.*

☞ *Greg Dolan tends to wear a suit jacket and dress pants—which makes him look a little like a school principal—which makes it that much more surprising when he kicks a song into high gear, from a low rumble to a howling solo. Beware the corporate-looking bluesman with the day job. There's a wildman ready to break on through!*



☞ *Speaking of wild men, Bassist Rocky Allen is the wolf in Dogz clothing. Sure he may at first seem like a mild-mannered photo-journalist, snapping close-ups of music legends across the Northwest. But when the moon rises over the mountains, Rocky transforms into Rockman, delivering soulful syncopation and versatility that comes from a lifetime of running with the pack. Allen rocks it like his back ain't got no bone.*

☞ *Steve Thorp, AKA Bucky Goldstein, adds smooth, soulful sounds to the aural landscape with his golden-throated, Greg Allman-inspired vocals. Steve developed his signature style in an Allman Brothers cover band, in addition to working with a host of other groups. Steve's voice is second only to his mastery of the keyboard, both piano and B3. From a rollicking romp to a simmering smolder, Bucky plays the keys like his life depends on it.*



☞ *If there's a show dog here, the guys agree Drummer Greg Rowe adds professional breeding and polish. He's the secret sauce, the key ingredient, bringing the band up to a whole new level. Wielding his sticks with quiet authority, he sets the pace that lets the RoadDogz run on-track and off-leash.*



Like the Dogz themselves, RoadDogz fans are loyal, and travel to catch them playing live. Fans have followed them from Seattle's J & M and Highway 99 to the Oxford Tavern in Snohomish to the Mt. Si Festival in North Bend. The band is also very supportive of local and national charities, cheering on the crowds with their high-energy sound at events like the MS Walk at Husky Stadium, Relay for Life in Snoqualmie and Seattle's Rock & Roll Marathon benefitting the American Cancer Society. They also helped organize a Blues Festival for Breast Cancer through the Blues Angel Foundation.

The guys are also a regular presence on local radio, and Dan co-hosts The Blueshouse Thursdays on KSER 90.7. Add BMI songwriting credits and song placement in popular TV shows like One Life to Live and Weeds, and now you've got national recognition. The RoadDogz' ever-expanding fan base reaches all the way to Europe, Japan and down under.



With a collective network of over 500 Facebook fans, more than 1000 friends, and social media skills to rival a teenager's, the Dogz bring solid marketing chops to the table. Their dedicated, updated website (www.roaddogz.com) featuring some sizzling photos of "Road Babes" buzzes with an average 100 hits a day. The RoadDogz lead the pack in audience integration.
